#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

1. In identifying individual sectors and sub-sectors, where specified, CPC means the Central Product Classification as set out in Statistical Office of the United Nations, Statistical Papers, Series M, No. 77, CPC Prov, 1991. Postal/courier services are defined in the related sector or sub-sector column. For Serbia telecom services are defined in the related sector or sub/sector column. Financial services are defined according to the Financial Services Section. A CPC code accompanied with one asterisks "\*" indicates that the service specified is a component of a more aggregated CPC item specified elsewhere in this classification list. A CPC code accompanied with double asterisks "\*\*" indicate that "part of" the sector is covered. "Unbound\*" indicate "lack of technical feasibility".

The ordering of the service sectors, sub-sectors and activities in this Schedule reflects the Services Sectoral Classification List contained in the WTO document MTN.GNS/W/120, dated 10 July 1991.

- 2. The rights and obligations arising from these Schedules of Specific Commitments shall have no self-executing effect and thus confer no rights directly on natural or juridical persons.
- 3. Nothing in these Schedules of Specific Commitments shall be construed to prejudice the enforcement of any measure under the foreign trade regime and related customs procedures of each Party with regard to goods, in compliance with international agreements that each Party is a member of. In this respect, with regard to service sectors, sub-sectors or activities where importation and/or exportation of goods might be an integral part of the supply of services, such as distribution services, maintenance and repair services, technical testing and analysis services, any relevant foreign trade and/or customs measure shall continue to apply, even if not listed, to services and services suppliers of the other Party.

Re/insurance companies, banks, broker and dealer companies, investment funds, founder of over the counter market and stock exchange must be incorporated as joint stock company. Exceptionally, a company for insurance brokerage, a company for insurance agency services, legal entities for provision of investment advisory services and company for investment fund management must be incorporated as a joint stock company or a limited liability company. Asset management company performing activity of managing and organizing voluntary pension funds must be established as a non-public joint stock company. Branches of financial institutions commercially established outside of Serbia will be allowed 7 years after Serbia's accession to the WTO.

Foreign banks may establish subsidiaries or representative offices<sup>19</sup> in the territory of Serbia. Only representative offices of foreign banks are allowed and may not perform banking operations - their scope of work is limited to market research, preparatory activities and representation of their home bank.

At least one member of the bank managing board and at least one member of the bank executive board must be fluent in Serbian language and have permanent residence in Serbia, while all other members of the executive board must have temporary residence in Serbia.

#### Insurance and insurance related services

Foreign re/insurance companies are required to establish subsidiaries which must be incorporated as joint stock companies. Branching will be allowed only 7 years after Serbia's accession to the WTO. An insurance company cannot provide both life and non-life insurance services simultaneously. Exceptionally, insurance company providing life insurance can perform accident insurance activities and voluntary health insurance covering the costs of medical treatment for the client with whom they already have signed life insurance policy.

At least one member of the re/insurance company supervisory board and at least one member of the executive board must be fluent in the Serbian language and have permanent residence in Serbia, while all other members of the executive board must have temporary residence in Serbia.

Brokers in insurance cannot provide insurance agency services.

Compulsory insurance schemes such as state health insurance, state pension insurance, deposit insurance are exclusively provided by public bodies (Republic Fund for Health Insurance, Fund for Pension and Disability Insurance and the Agency for Insurance of Deposits, respectively), although those services can be provided on the commercial bases above prescribed minimum of social protection.

#### Capital market and investment services

Pursuant to laws governing capital market and investment funds only financial institution established and registered in Serbia, licensed by a competent authority in Serbia (such as the National Bank of Serbia (NBS), the Serbia Securities Commission (SEC)) can provide in Serbia investment services and activities relating to capital market.

All investment and ancillary investment services in accordance with Capital Market Law can be performed only by investment firms (broker-dealer company and authorized bank) established in Serbia and licensed by SEC for provision of those services. Only ancillary services can be performed by credit institution licensed by NBS, without SEC license.

Only investment firms holding a license of SEC may trade on a regulated market or Multilateral Trading Facilitate (MTF), while other persons may trade on such markets only through the mediation of such firms. Only investment firms licensed by SEC shall be entitled to intermediate transactions in an Over-the-Counter (OTC) market. An investment firm shall not initiate the activity for which it has obtained the license, prior to the entry of this activity into the Company Register in Serbia.

Clearing and settlement obligations arising from the transactions in financial instruments concluded in Serbia shall be met only through the Central Registry, Depository and Clearing of Securities (a joint stock company with at least 51% of state capital). Right of access to the information and documents of the Central Securities Depositary (CSD) shall have only a member of the CSD keeping the accounts for the lawful holders, the lawful holder of a financial instrument, and any person who proves their legal interest in the financial instrument.

Law on investment funds regulate the activities and operations of investment funds through management companies licensed by the competent institutions in Serbia, which can be established by domestic and foreign natural and legal persons under the same conditions.

All collective investment undertakings established in Serbia in accordance with Law on Investment Funds must be managed by management company, established in the Republic of Serbia and licensed by SEC.

Custody services are provided by custody banks which are credit institutions licensed by SEC for performing these services, and established in Serbia.

Law on voluntary pension funds and pension schemes regulate activities of voluntary pension fund and management companies than manage those funds. According to the mentioned laws, voluntary pension funds can be organized and managed exclusively by licensed voluntary pension fund management companies established in Serbia.

Management companies can be established by domestic or foreign natural and legal person. A stake of over 50% in capital, and/or voting rights in a management company must be held by a legal entity engaged in banking, insurance or pension fund activities, or by a person holding in the said person a stake of more than 50% in capital and/or voting rights.

Without prejudice to the scope of activities which may be considered as "cabotage" under the relevant national legislation, this schedule does not include "maritime cabotage services", which are assumed to cover transportation of passengers or goods between a port located in Turkey and another port located in Turkey, and traffic originating and terminating in the same port located in Turkey provided that this traffic remains within Turkey's territorial waters. In addition, according to the "Law Concerning Coastal Shipping (Cabotage) along Turkish Shores and Performance of Trade and Business in Turkish Ports and Territorial Waters" (Law No: 815), the right to transport goods and passengers from one point to another along Turkish shores and to perform towing and piloting, and all other port services of any type, whatsoever, within or between Turkish ports and shores shall belong exclusively to ships and vessels that fly the Turkish flag in accordance with Article 940 of the Turkish Commercial Code (Law No. 6102). Vessels carrying the Turkish flag in accordance with the Law on Turkish International Ship Registry (Law No. 4490) but not fulfilling the requirements of Article 940 of Turkish Commercial Code cannot perform the aforementioned functions falling within the scope of cabotage rights. For further clarification, this Schedule does not establish any right for the conduct of activities falling under cabotage rights as stipulated in the "Law Concerning Coastal Shipping (Cabotage) along Turkish Shores and Performance of Trade and Business in Turkish Ports and Territorial Waters" (Law No. 815).

All Turkish ships shall fly the Turkish flag. A ship shall be regarded as Turkish only if its owner (or owners) is/are Turkish. However, the following ships shall also be considered as Turkish: i) Ships which belong to legal persons such as bodies, institutions, associations and foundations set up in accordance with Turkish Law, the majority of whose Board of Directors are of Turkish nationality; ii) Ships which belong to the trading companies, the majority of whose managerial staff and representatives are of Turkish nationality and are registered on the Turkish Trade Register.
